

- Conquered by Persian-Media Empire






"Hanging Gardens of Babylon" by Martin Heemskerck (Dutch)

· Achaemenid Imperial Army


• 5<sup>th</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> Century B.C.

- Iran 1979 Islamic Revolution Shia dominated
- 1979-1987 Iran-Iraq War
- 1990 Kuwait Invasion / Desert Shield and Storm

- Democracy, Politics, and Violent Extremists
- 2010 Operation New Dawn

- Supreme Council for Islamic Revolution in Iraq (SCIRI; now Supreme Islamic Iraqi Council "SIIC")
  - Ayatollah Muhammad Baqr al-Hakim (d. 2003)
  - Abdul Aziz al-Hakim (d. 2009) son Ammar (successor)
  - Al Dawa Party (Tribe of Nouri Al-Maliki)

Grand Ayatollah Ali al-Husayni al-Sistani (1930 - \_\_\_)

- Born in Iran
- Lives in Najaf
- Litihad passes own judgments



- Moderate aligned with [deceased] Ayatollah Khomeini - Global Shia respect
  - -Militant → -Aligned with Iran -Mahdi Army Militia



- Born in Iraq
- Lives in Sadr City and Iran

Cleric Muqtada Al-Sadr (1973 - \_\_)

- Low to mid-level cleric
- Father was a Grand Ayotallah



# LA: Limitations: Communication

- Commercial line Not available.
  - Use of DSN operator to dial commercial, however:
    - Many parts of the U.S. are not accessible if they are not close enough to a military installation;
    - Other areas only allow a 15 minute morale call;
    - Connection often interrupted/disconnected; and
    - Approx. 5-10 minute process to connect per call, no call back or voicemail option. During peak times, connection becomes very difficult.
- SKYPE Unsecure or Secure?

#### LA: Limitations: Communication

• Time zone difference

- Eastern Standard Time = Iraq - 7 hours Pacific Standard Time = Iraq - 10 hours = Iraq - 11 hours - Alaska Standard Time - Hawaii Standard Time = Iraq - 12 hours

- Telephonic consultation
  - Common to represent client on satellite FOB by telephone.
    - Difficulties: Client access, delays in connection
- Internet connectivity
  - Access limited to theater approved websites

# LA: Eligible Population

- Eligible Clients:
  - Service members (SM), or retired SM
  - Family of SM
  - DoS, DoD
  - Contractors if authorized by contract:
    - Predominantly not authorized by contract
    - If authorized, often limited in scope
    - Civilian attorney referral

# Release of Information: HIPAA

- References:
  - DOD Regulation 6025.18-R
  - AR 40-66
- Commander or Designee (limited reasons, e.g., fitness for duty, security)
- Patient Consent
- Attorney / Power of Attorney / Court-Appt.
- TIPs:
  - Many sources electronic, paper, verbal (HCP);
  - Protection survives death (unlike Privacy Act)

# Release of Information: FOIA

- Casualty information for Family / NOK
- Claims potential
- Incident information
  - Legal Investigations (15-6, JAGMAN, etc.)
  - Line of Duty benefits?
- Exclusions (eg, CID, NCIS, OSI)
- TIPs:
  - Storage issues: parent units vs. deployed units
  - Classification issues: SIRs, SIGACTS, reports

- Letter of Concern
- Basis Complaint, Investigation, Inquiry,
- Rebuttals
- Filing Determinations

# Personnel Actions: Responses

#### Tips:

- Be accurate
- Be brief
- Be consistent

#### Format:

- State BLUF or Relief requested
- Avoid mud-slinging
- Do not rebut until there is something to rebut

# **Personnel Actions: Evaluations**

- References
  - AR 623-3
  - DA PAM 623-3
- Types of Redress
  - Unit Personnel office can request minor changes
  - Commander's or Commandant's Inquiry
  - Appeal
  - Board of Correction for Military Records
- Each is mutually exclusive

# Personnel Actions: Evaluations

- Commander's or Commandant's Inquiry
  - Review of a Subordinate's Report of ratee
  - Determine: llegal, unjust, or in viol. of regulation?
  - Can provide to Subordinate but cannot force Subordinate to change rating
  - Can forward to Human Resources Command
- Appeals
  - Administrative Error
  - Substantive Error
  - Substantiated evidence required

# **Investigations: HCP**

- Homosexual Conduct Policy
- General Officer Inquiries
- Credible Information to initiate(sworn)
- Evidence Required (Conduct-based S.A.M.)
- General Officer Disposition
- Tip: Encourage clients to listen to your legal advice, not news reports
- Current Events:
  - Policy under Executive Review
  - Judicial Involvement

# Investigations: Line of Duty

• Reference: 10 USC 1074; AR 600-8-4

- Findings:
  - "in line of duty"
  - "not in line of duty due to own misconduct"
- Misconduct:
  - Does not include simple or ordinary negligence per se
  - Lose benefits, including possible VA
  - Maintain medical while on Active Duty
  - Soldier may appeal w/n 30 days of receipt of notice
  - HRC or Disability Board may change finding
- Suicide cases (an exception)

#### Mental Incompetency: Payments

37 USC Chapter 11 - PAYMENTS TO MENTALLY INCOMPETENT PERSONS

37 USC Chapter 11 - PAYMENTS TO MENTALLY INCOMPETENT PERSONS
690. Payments, elegination of person to receive amounts due
(a) Active duty pay and allowances, amounts due for accrued or accumulated leave, or retired or retainer pay, that are otherwise payable
to a member to whom this chapter applies and who, in the opinion of a board of medical officers or physicians; is mentally incapable
of managing his affairs, may be paid for that member's use or benefit to any person designated by the Secretary concerned, or by
any officer to whom he delegates his authority under this section, without the appointment in judicial proceedings of a committee,
guardian, or other legal representative.
(B) The board shall consist of at least three qualified medical officers or physicians, one of whom is specially qualified in the treatment of
mental disorders, appointed from available medical officers or physicians under his jurisdiction by the head of whichever of the
following is providing medical treatment for the member, or by a person designated by that head—
(1) Department of the Army;
(2) Department of the Army;
(3) Department of the Army;
(4) Department of Health and Human Services; or

(4) Department of Health and Human Services; or

(5) Department of Veterans Affairs.

w J vegarumen v vettera Alaria. If the hospitalization or medical care of the member is not provided by the United States, the board shall be appointed by the Secretary of the department having jurisdiction of the member.

(2) A payment made to a person who is designated under this section discharges the obligation of the United States as to the amount paid.

(e) This section does not apply in any case in which a legal committee, guardian, or other representative has been appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction, except as to payments made before the paying agency of the department concerned receives notice of that

(f) A person who is designated to receive payments under this section shall furnish satisfactory assurance that the amounts received by him will be applied to the use and benefit of the incompetent member, and, where the payments may reasonably be expected to be

- Inspector General (IG)
  - Violations of regulation, procedure, law
- Equal Opportunity (EO)
  - Discrimination: Race, color, gender, national origin, or religion
  - Sexual Harassment / hostile work environment
- Article 138, UCMJ Complaints to GCMCA
- Congressional Inquiries
- → Intended and Unintended Consequences?
